

Cemetery Committee Highlights

The Committee encountered once in a lifetime expenses in 1995. Two diseased elm trees had to be cut and removed. To complete the concrete step job properly, landscape work was required. In addition to labour costs, loads of earth and several yards of sod were needed. The costs of looking after the church yard and cemetery area was in line with previous years. It was decided that the committee would pay the same amount as in previous years (approximately \$1000.00) and the Trust Fund would absorb the balance. Four trees were planted this spring (1996) at no cost!

Maintenance Committee Highlights

Members of the Committee appreciate the many favourable remarks received concerning the projects completed in 1995. The new concrete steps with the ramp received the most compliments. The re-nailing of the roof was considered a wise move.

The major project currently being tackled is the restoration of the shutters. Contractors would like a commitment for the complete job. We are not able to make this type of commitment due to our limited finances. One shutter on the south-west side has been restored. We will be pleased to hear from you. Your criticism, as well as your words of encouragement.
